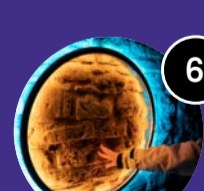
3 Lamps of Love

Dark boxes invite you to scratch your wishes for the future and reveal rainbows that unite us all. A UK premiere, with support from the Taipei Representative Office in the UK.



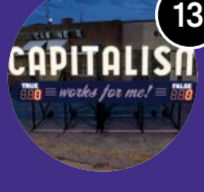
10 Dust

A blend of the seaside-amusement fun machine with the latest RGB-technology. Make the ball come to life and discover your inner love quotient.



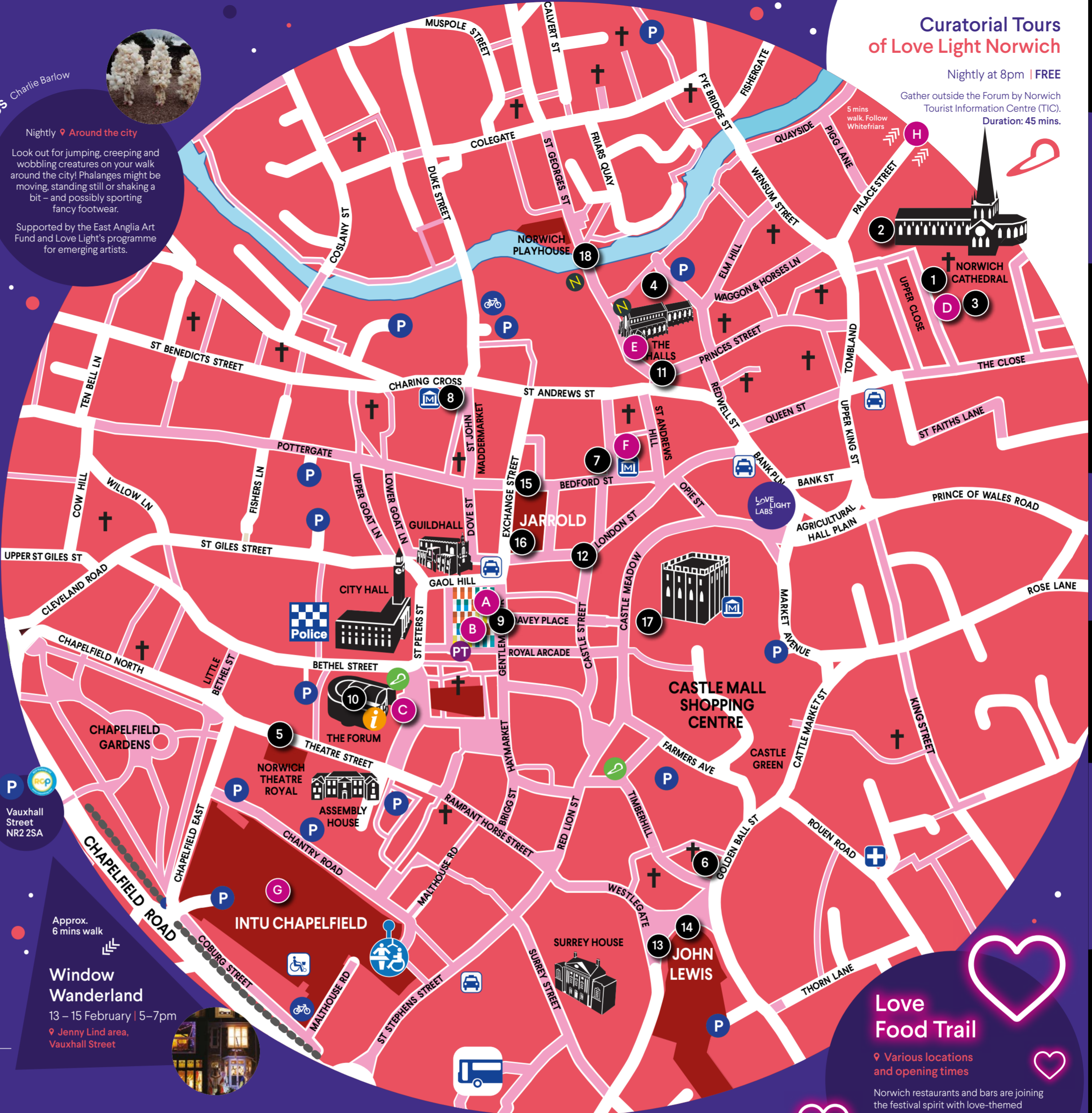
12 Happy Heads

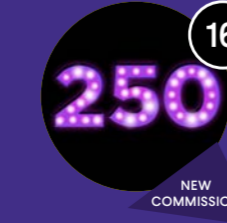


Phalanges Charlie Barlow

Supported by the East Anglia Art Fund and Love Light's programme for emerging artists.

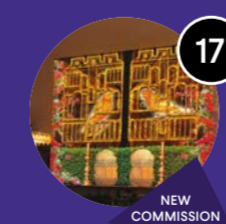

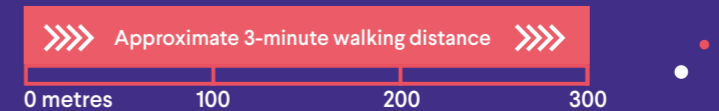
17 Lovebirds
