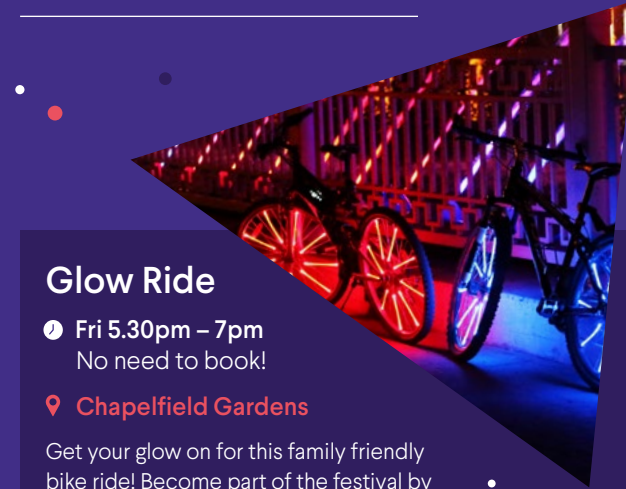

Travel

You can see all the fantastic artwork on show at Love Light Norwich by foot, and take as long as you need to do so. The furthest two exhibitions are less than a mile apart, and there's plenty to see en route.

When travelling into Norwich, we'd love it if you could choose a sustainable method of transport, whether cycling, by foot, or public transport like buses, rail, or Park & Ride – the Thickthorn and Airport Park & Ride will be running until 10.20pm.

Accessibility

We've worked hard to make Love Light Norwich as accessible as possible, and are working with community groups from across the city to bring people together. All of the festival is completely free, and the pieces have been chosen with accessibility in mind.



Sustainability

All the installations have been made as energy efficient as possible. When choosing the work exhibited, the environmental impact was considered. Whenever possible, mains power is used rather than a generator, and the pieces will use low-energy LEDs. Streetlights have been switched off or had the brightness reduced; saving power, and reducing light pollution. We have done our best to procure locally, and reduce the festival's overall carbon footprint.

1 Luminous Pareidolia

Returning after a phenomenal 2020 debut, the exterior of Norwich Cathedral will once again be transformed into a magnificent canvas. Intricate designs combine to create mesmerising and striking projections.



2 Marsh Ponies

Sarah Cannell, Rachael Long and Andy Jarrett

📍 **Norwich Cathedral Green**

Inspired by the myths of the fens, these life size pony sculptures conjure an earlier age in East Anglian history, trotting across the Cathedral Green in welded steel.



3 One Star Awake

Laura Cannell (Violin) and Kate Ellis (Cello/Church Organ)

📍 **Tombland Alley**

Watch this bewitching short film of the Marsh Ponies, layered with a new musical interpretation of 'She Moved Through The Fair', projected onto St George's Church in a beautiful experience.

This interactive piece combines live drawing with projection, creating an ever-evolving illustration lighting up the 14th century flint walls of The Halls. You could even inspire the illustrations in this intimate art-performance.

Vibrant flowers are suspended in crystal clear ice and captured in heart shape patterns, in this striking frozen sculpture of bright floral colours.

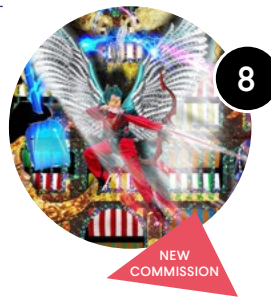


7 Make a Wish

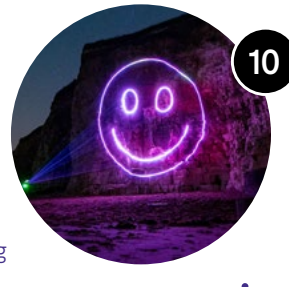


9 Out of the Cocoon

This solar-powered sculpture sparkles with iridescent light, capturing the translucent beauty of a butterfly, and was created with sustainability at its heart.

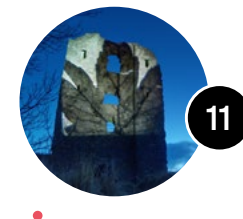


10 DeafPLUR

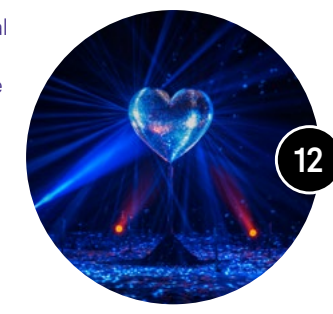


11 Macroscopic I

Marvel at this video and light installation that combines geometric animations with vibrant colours and an upbeat soundtrack.

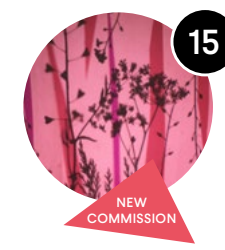

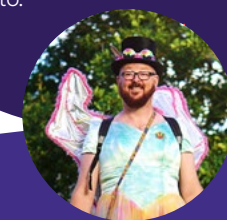
